



> euroAtlantic hands over to VEM, TAP Portugal's maintenance company in Brazil, four Boeing 767-300 for programmed inspections

Lisbon, August 18, 2008

euroAtlantic airways handed over to VEM Engenharia e Manutenção, the aeronautical maintenance company controlled by TAP Portugal in Brazil, four Boeing B767-300 for programmed maintenance Works (Check C) that include the entire structure and elements of the planes. The founder and President of euroAtlantic - company partly owned by Grupo Pestana - Tomás Metello, said that “the commissioning of services to VEM may reach 1,703 million Euros (2,5 million dollars). EuroAtlantic’s administration made this decision based on VEM’s guarantees of quality of services, because VEM in competitive and because we always contract companies of Portuguese capital”, said Tomás Metello.

One of euroAtlantic airways’ planes currently at VEM will, in addition to being submitted to the programmed heavy works, have the configuration of the cockpit altered, while a second plane will receive extensive painting. The “Check C”s occur every year and a half of the working life of the planes, for periods of about three weeks, although, if necessary, the works may extend for eight weeks
